



What is the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG)

- Established by the Housing and Community Act of 1974
- Funds originate in U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
- Administered by the Missouri Department of Economic Development

Who's Eligible

- Only "non-entitlement" Units of General Local Government (UGLG) are eligible for State CDBG
 - Cities that are less 50,000 in population
 - Counties that are less 200,000 in population

CDBG Program Distribution

<u>Category</u>	App. Cycle	Appropriation	<u>Total</u>
Water and Wastewater	open	\$7,500,000	37%
General Infrastructure	Competitive	\$3,000,000	15%
Community Facility	Competitive	\$3,000,000	15%
Demolition	Competitive	\$600,000	3%

All of these categories use the FY-17 annual application.

CDBG National Objective

- Must be determined PRIOR to application
- National Objectives:
 - 51% Low/Moderate Income (LMI) beneficiaries
 - ▶ LMI persons and families with incomes at or below80% of the county median household income.
 - Elimination of Slum and Blight
 - Urgent threat to health and safety (Emergency Projects separate application)

General Infrastructure

- CDBG-eligible publicly owned infrastructure activities
 - Streets
 - Bridges
 - Drainage
- Typical National Objective:
 - LMI area/target area
 - Slum blight

Demolition

- Voluntary program, property owners must agree to have structure demolished.
- Property owners retain ownership of lot.
- Commercial property owners must commit 20% match.
- Residential property owners must commit to a minimum of \$500 per structure

Community Facilities

- Construction/rehabilitation/acquisition of facility (can include necessary related infrastructure)
- Includes, but not limited to:
 - Senior centers
 - Community centers
 - Day care facilities/early childhood education
 - Sheltered workshops
 - Fire stations
 - ADA improvements in public buildings
 - Operating costs are ineligible

Community Facilities

Priorities:

- What are the uses? Multiple?
 - education/training uses?
 - health and well being uses?

For ADA:

- Need SHPO clearance with application
- Need full accessibility plan

Water and Wastewater

Budget: \$7,500,000

Open Application Cycle (with invitation)

- Missouri Water & Wastewater Review
- Committee (MWWRC) process
 - Submit MWWRC proposal first
 - Requires an invitation to apply for CDBG
- Publicly owned systems only

Water and Wastewater

- Priorities
- Actual threats to health and safety
- Systems with responsible rate structures
 - promote positive cash flow
 - allow adequate O&M
 - allow for reserve
 - allow for debt or capital improvement fund
- Expansion or upgrade of projects not related to poor maintenance or repair
- Helping communities who are helping themselves
- Helping communities that recognize the role of sound infrastructure in community development

Contingent Funding

- Not allowed; all other funding sources must be committed at the time of CDBG application
 - Maximize local funds
 - Maximize other funding sources
- CDBG is gap financing tool final piece of financing package
