


SMART MANAGEMENT FOR SMALL WATER SYSTEMS ROUNDS 1 & 2 PROGRAM REVIEW | 2012-2015

During both rounds of the Managerial and Financial Capacity technical assistance program, the Environmental Finance Center Network (EFCN), and its partner, the American Water Works Association (AWWA), have delivered in-person workshops in every state and territory, offered technical assistance to any small system community expressing interest, and hosted more than three-dozen webinars reaching a national audience. Nearly every workshop or webinar was approved for state-specific continuing education credits. The project team has created and provided training on dashboard benchmarking tools for several states, offered energy and regionalization small group trainings, and have created eLearning modules.

The program is funded by a cooperative agreement with the U.S. EPA. All deliverables have been met or exceeded for this program. Below, you will find some information specific to our efforts in your state.


