### Where did the Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund Come From?

- Funds from 2013 State v. Exxon Corp., et. al MtBE Trial Verdict
- SB 380 Established the Fund and the Advisory Commission
- Use of Funds Governed by RSA 485-F
- 19 Member Advisory Commission
- \$187 M current balance

#### Role of the Advisory Commission

• Established the Mission (Oct 2017):


The DWGTF is Intended to Provide Protection, Preservation, and Enhancement of the Drinking Water and Groundwater Resources of the State

- Award Grants and Loans to Projects on a Competitive Basis
- Develop and Lead the Project Selection Process



#### 2017-2018 Accomplishments

- Approximately \$93M in Grants and Loans Approved
- 15 Infrastructure Projects Underway or Completed from 2017 Approvals
- 110 Applications in 2018 Represents Significant Need in NH
- 19 Drinking Water Infrastructure Projects Approved in 2018
- 15 Source Water Protection Projects Approved in 2018




### Commission Approved Projects

#### 2019 Award Program\*

- \*Concept developed by a Subcommittee not approved by vote by Advisory Commission (anticipated April 16)
  - Propose Annual Program for Drinking Water Construction Projects
  - Focus on drinking water system improvements
- September 13, 2019 Application Deadline
- Application expanded from 2018
- Rate is a component of the Advisory Commission project considerations:
  - Median household income (MHI)
  - Current annual residential water rate
  - Projected annual residential water rate at project completion
