
Can your system benefit from an MHI

- Does your system have enough reserves to fund infrastructure replacement
- Have a future compliance project
- Planning to apply for funding
- Planning a rate increase
- A DAC/SDAC in the past



What are the benefits...

- Helps you develop a more solid plan for replacement of critical assets
- Determine if your system is indeed a DAC/SDAC
- Help determine an affordable service rate for your community
- Determine what type of funding is truly available to your system

And the answer is...

American Community Survey

- Conducted every month, every year
- Sent to a sample of addresses
- Asks about topics not on the 2020 Census, such as education, employment, and housing




2020 Census

- Conducted every10 years
- Counts every
 person living in
 the 50 states,
 DC, and five US
 territories
- Also asks age, sex, race, etc


Using your MHI as a management tool

- Timing is everything






MHI Process




Who pays for the survey?
