	Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation <i>(water, wastewater)</i>	The Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act of 2014 (WIFIA) established the WIFIA program, a federal credit program administered by EPA for eligible water and wastewater infrastructure projects. The WIFIA program offers loans with low, fixed interest rates and flexible financial terms. The minimum project size for small communities, population of 25,000 or less, is \$5 million.	The WIFIA application process is three phases. Prospective borrowers must submit a letter of interest for their project to the WIFIA program by July 6, 2018. 	Micro-Credit Loan (small business)	The Micro-Credit Loan program offers a secured loan subject to creditworthiness of applicant. Loan amounts shall be from \$1,000 to \$50,000. 	State Small Business Credit Initiative (small business)	The State Small Business Credit Initiative Program was created by the 2010 Small Business Jobs Act to support small business lending and encourage financial institutions to be more aggressive in their lending activities. The maximum borrower size should be 750 employees or less. Corporations, partnerships, and sole proprietorships are eligible. The legislation allows hotel developers to use a portion of their hotel occupancy and casino taxes to repay long-term loans, which can help in obtaining financing, such as collateral, for projects.
