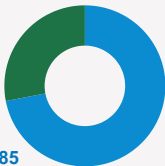


EFCN ACTION ADDS UP SINCE 2012

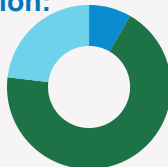

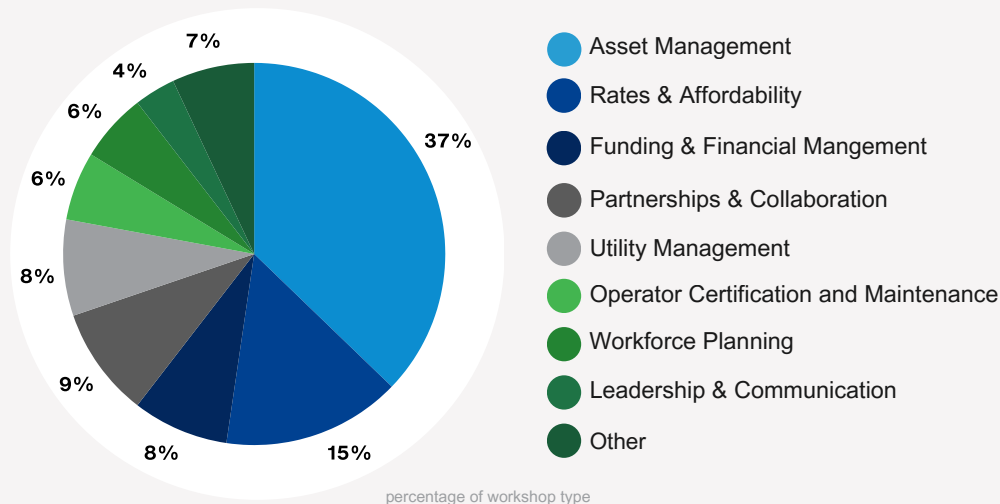

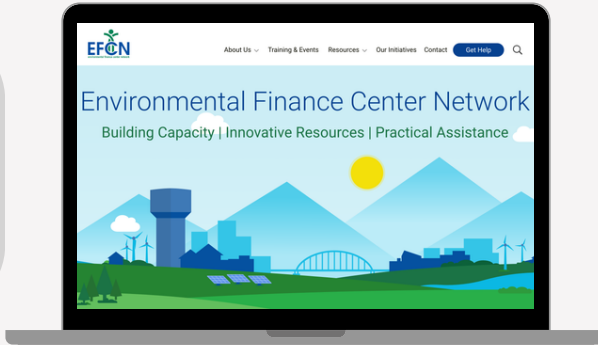
